## SPU will be working in your neighborhood

**PROJECT:** Many of the sanitary sewer lines in the City of Seattle are at least 50 years old and they are showing the wear expected of infrastructure of that age. A contractor for Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) will reline the sewer line in your neighborhood as part of citywide sewer line rehabilitation efforts.

**BENEFITS:** Repairing pipes can help prevent future service disruption caused by a sewer line break.

**DATES/TIMES:** The project is expected to start in early February and extend into March. The project consists of two parts: cleaning and relining. First, the pipes will be cleaned a few weeks prior to the relining work. Then the reline work at each site will last approximately one to two days. General working hours will be 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with the possibility of occasional weekend work. However, working hours may be shortened to 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in order to minimize traffic disruptions on arterial streets.

**LOCATION: 811 W Blaine St** 

## **CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS:**

- Access to street and/or parking will be limited; at the end of each working day, access to each site will be restored to allow for regular traffic
- On-street parking may be temporarily reduced
- Increased construction truck traffic and some noise is likely
